Dear Cup family and friends,

For the church as a whole, the transitional process has since moved from the analysis and visioneering of last year into the start of the pastoral search committee and the committee's first interviews. 


Honoring our High School Grads

MARC SHEFELTON is a 2024 graduate of Erskine Theological Seminary with a Doctor of Ministry (concentration in Church Vitality)


TRINITY SCHOOL OF MINISTRY
